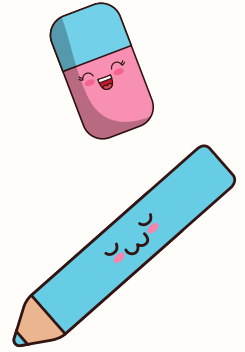

2023 SCHOOL BUSES

We have been given assurance by Alec Birch from the Masterton District Council that our roads will be safe to travel on so we are going with that advice. Our bus drivers have been given the message to be wary and more vigilant than normal to ensure we all get to and from school safely. As a friendly reminder please remember if there are any changes to what bus you would like your child on please give us at least 24 hours' notice. There are minimal spaces available on buses at certain times but please ask and we will help where we possibly can. The town bus now has two pick up and drop off points in town and these are Henley Lake and the Colombo Road Alleyway.
