One hour a day



You may have seen reports in the media about the implementation of a new educational policy starting from Term 1 of 2024. Children in Years 0–8 will receive one hour of instruction per day in reading, writing, and mathematics. Research suggests that consistent daily teaching, paired with a well-structured curriculum and effective pedagogical methods, can significantly enhance children's academic growth and success. At Whareama School, we have been already meeting these requirements, so this will not be a big change. We are committed to maintaining a holistic curriculum at Whareama School, ensuring that our students have access to a diverse array of educational opportunities. Our aim is to provide a comprehensive learning experience that nurtures the development of our students across various curriculum areas.

What will the lessons look like?

The National Curriculum outlines what your child should be able to **understand**, **know** and **do** as they progress through their school years. Teachers will continue to use the curriculum and teach in ways that best suit the learning. This includes using things like active learning opportunities, group work, investigations, practice, and consolidation activities.

How you can help at home

- having your child read to you, reading to your child and talking about books and stories
- encouraging your child to share what they think about a book (or video game, podcast, or movie), and being positive about the material they are reading, listening, or watching
- letting your child see you enjoy books, audiobooks, podcasts, games, movies, or videos in your first language
- encouraging your child to write, and talking with your child about what they are writing
- showing your child that you write for lots of reasons too, such as replying to an email, filling out a form, or writing an invitation or letter

- involving your child in activities where you use maths (for example playing games with cards or dice, grocery shopping, cooking, and DIY activities)
- encouraging your child to share how they solve mathematics problems (they may use different mental or written strategies to the ones you were taught)
- being positive about your child's reading, writing, and maths experiences, and praising their efforts.

School Buses



For those children who use the Henley Lake school bus when seats are available to travel to or from town, and who are normally on the Homewood or Awatoitoi bus, a **charge of \$2 per trip will apply**. This fee will be invoiced to the parents at the end of the term for the trips their child/children have taken. The cost associated with each trip covers maintenance of the bus and diesel expenses.

As a friendly reminder please remember if there are any changes to what bus you would like your child on please give us at least 24 hours' notice. There are minimal spaces available on buses at certain times but please ask and we will help where we possibly can. The town bus now has one pick up and drop off point in town and this will now be only Henley Lake. The phone number contacts for the bus drivers are Tania 0273429952 for the town bus, Deb 0274448077 for the Homewood bus and 0224247013 for Matthew driving the ICA/Blairlogie bus. If your child is not on their bus for any reason please let your bus driver know as soon as possible, preferably by 7.45am


Quick Guide to SchoolDocs for the School Community
